



Proclamation

WHEREAS, each year, more than 20,000 children and 20,000 adults—are diagnosed with type 1 diabetes (T1D) in the United States; and

WHEREAS, the National Institutes of Health (NIH) reports that T1D among people under age 20 rose by 21 percent between 2001 and 2009, and if unabated the prevalence of the disease will double every generation; and

WHEREAS, T1D accounts for nearly \$15 billion a year in healthcare costs and diabetes in all forms costs the American economy \$245 billion a year; and

WHEREAS, Juvenile Diabetes Research Fund (JDRF) is the leading global organization funding research to end T1D, and is committed to an ongoing stream of life-changing therapies that lessen the impact of T1D;


NOW, THEREFORE, I, Z Marshall, Mayor of the City of Parker, Texas, do hereby proclaim November 1 to be
